In accordance with Section 102(w) of the Energy Act 2006, a person convicted of retailing petroleum products above the maximum levels will be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya shillings one million, or the withdrawal of their operating licence or both. In this respect consumers are requested to be vigilant and report non-compliant retailers to the authorities for necessary legal action.

The Commission maintains a Short Message Service (SMS) based inquiry system for petroleum pump prices where members of the public can obtain the latest petroleum prices in major towns by sending the message: **"price <space> name of major town"** to **0707667623**.

The Commission wishes to assure the general public of its continued commitment to the observance of fair competition and protection of the interests of both consumers and investors in the energy and petroleum sectors. As part of petroleum motor fuels quality management, consumer protection and prevention of tax evasion, the Commission undertakes petroleum fuels marking and monitoring to deter motor fuels adulteration and dumping of export bound petroleum products into the local market.

Over the years, the program has been successful with a compliance level of about 97%. Recently, the Commission in collaboration with the National Police Service undertook successful operations in Uasin Gishu and Bungoma Counties where seven (7) unlicensed petroleum storage sites were demolished and operators charged.

Motor fuels adulteration is detrimental to the economy with conservative estimates putting the total loss to the country at KShs.9.2 billion per annum. This is in addition to high vehicle maintenance costs that result after consumption of adulterated fuels. The Commission urges motorists who experience jerking, excessive smoke from the exhaust, loss of engine power and sometimes complete engine stalls immediately after fueling to report to the Commission through hot line numbers: **0708 444 000** and **0709 336 000**. This will enable the Commission to undertake comprehensive tests of the motor fuels in the suspect retail station and sanction the operator in the event of non-conforming motor fuels. To this end, consumers are urged to always obtain receipts or retain evidence of transactions whenever they purchase petroleum fuels from retail stations.
